### **Seniors: Apply for scholarships now!**

Now is the time when high school Crusaders in their senior year should get started on applying for college scholarships. These three steps will keep you on track:

- 1 Complete your Crusader Pledge Affirmation Form** If you did not receive this form in the mail, ask your College Crusade Advisor or print it from the Scholarship section of our website. You can also call us at 854-5500 and ask us to mail you the form. Fill it out and send it to us.
- 2 Complete your FAFSA** You must complete a FAFSA to apply for a College Crusade Scholarship. Your FAFSA also serves as your application for a federal Pell Grant and a RI State Grant. **You must complete your FAFSA application after January 1 and before March 1** to be considered for a state grant. Complete the

FAFSA online by following the steps at **www.fafsa.ed.gov**. To get a paper application, call 1-800-433-3243. **We can help you fill out your FAFSA! See page 3.**

- 3 Research other sources of free aid** Colleges often award their own grants or scholarships. This is free money that you do not need to work for or to pay back. Go to college websites or ask their admissions offices how to apply for these free awards. Have your FAFSA sent to all the schools where you wish to attend. Research other organizations that provide grants or scholarships to qualified individuals. Make a list of application deadlines and other details. Here are some good places to start:

Plenty of help is available for high school Crusaders who have their sights set on college next year. Filling out your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form has never been easier!

## College Goal Sunday – January 27

College Goal Sunday is a free program that helps students and families fill out the FAFSA, which is the form you must submit to apply for financial assistance for college. Come get hands-on help and advice from financial aid professionals. College Goal Sunday runs **from 1:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m.** at three campuses of the Community College of Rhode Island:
